
BLOCK 5 FLOWERING FAN



This month's block is a paper pieced block.

The pattern will print in 4 pages and must be taped together to get the **12.5** inch <u>unfinished</u> block. Use the picture above for the proper order of the pattern pages.

IMPORTANT – when printing, make sure you set your printer to actual size – do not let the printer resize the pattern. There is also a 1-inch mark on the first page to check you scale after printing.

Remember the basic block is 12 inches. Line A is the 12" finished size. Line B is the 12.5" unfinished size and includes the ¼ inch seam allowance – do not cut this line off when you trim your pattern sections. Don't worry about the heavy black lines (Line A) being a smidge beyond 12 inches. This will take care of itself when you trim the final block.

The 12 inch block outline does not come to the edge of the inner pages – this is where you make sure the black lines meet when you put the 4-pieces together.

Piece the fan parts in the order numbered. Remember to let the fabric extend over the seam lines to cover the seam allowance.

IMPORTANT FOR THIS BLOCK

This block is designed to be done in two sections – Part A and Part B. The line between the two sections is the diagonal middle of the block. After piecing the four sections together, cut the pattern on the diagonal middle line.

Piece the two sections. When you get to the part 7/part 9 outer edge, be sure to leave the ¼ inch seam allowance to piece the two sections together.

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Trim the block to 12.5 inches.
